EZEKIEL 2:2-5

Even when the people rebel, God does not desert them. He sends them a prophet to preach repentance.

R: Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy.

2 CORINTHIANS 12:7-10

In his own person, Paul experiences the paradox of salvation: when he is weak, there is room for God's power to work at full force.

MARK 6:1-6

In his own hometown, Jesus discovers that his neighbors know him too well. Familiarity blinds them to his true identity.

Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Jesus said to them,

"A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.
