

2024 ANNUAL PARISH PICNIC EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS, TOPS LAST YEAR'S SUCCESS!

Despite New Challenges, Picnic Committee, Workers Pleased with Results

CUMRU TOWNSHIP- Picnic Committee members and volunteer workers met in the St. Stephen's Fellowship Hall for post-picnic debriefing, Sunday, September 8 to discuss "the good, the bad & the ugly" of this year's annual fund-raising event.

In the end, while opinions varied from voices heard that day, the overall response was largely positive.

According to the majority of picnic committee members, the main stumbling event for the event was dealing with the flea market vendors, attendees and traffic. These factors caused a variety of logistic issues including: setting-up, use of the golf carts, confusion over picnic food lines, and gate/parking personnel. Although Pat Konopelski did a great job of trying to keep matters flowing, etc. the double-event situation proved to be a problem until about 1:30 - 2 pm.

Hence, there was overwhelming support to move next year's picnic to Saturday, August 9, Noon 'til 6 pm. This will also make the breakdown of the picnic equipment and transport back to the church easier, and gives all who work the picnic Sunday to recooperate. That is a benefit, as well!

The news everyone seems to be anxious to hear is how well did we do financially. While Joe Faranda is still pouring over figures, receipts and countless notes from various departments, the bottom line will be in the \$18,000 range. That is a net figure after all expenses and re-imbursements are made.

Here are some bullet points from that recent picnic committee meeting:

• *Re-work the food lines (especially the platzki, soup stand and bake sale).*

• Move the Beer Wagon closer to the bar, move the Welcome Tent further away from the band to converse with patrons, and move the Children's Activity Tent in the center near the swings and playground area.

• Move the refrigerator trailer and food takeout station on the other side of the kitchen doors where it can have better visibility.

• ADD THE FOLLOWING: more, larger signs, arrows, large price sheet/map, first aid station on the grounds, solicit help from a

Lion's Club, local sports team, etc. • Additional help is needed in the following areas: a set-up crew day before (five people required), kitchen crew needed from early morning through afternoon to heat food as needed, check on food temps, move heavy pans of food and other supplies.

• We need to use two kiosk's for ticket sales, welcome area and raffle ticket sales, etc.

• Linda S. is officially retiring from golumpki-making. Carole Celius said she would be a major planner/worker but defers heading up the position to someone else.

• Agreed to review heating and serving food procedures. This is needed to achieve better serving times and eliminate broken pierogi and golumpki that create waste and reduce profits.

• The Y.M.S. of R. has agreed to purchase 10 lighter, plastic folding tables for the food service. Two additional tables have been donated to the cause.

• Gate/Parking Crew suggested that we have Entrance/Exit Signs made. and agreed some parking donations were lost due to those attending the flea market. Despite

those issues (*plus neighborhood walk-ins) the gate fees were up slightly over 2023. Therefore, our net profit likely would have been greater, as well!

• T-shirts will be ordered for next year in a new color scheme and offered for sale to the public.

As of this printing a meeting with Pat Konopelski has been scheduled to go over next year's details on Thursday, Sept. 26 @ 3:30 pm at the catering office. Anyone wish to attend, please inform Fr. Sr. Donald.

Picnic Chairperson, Jay Rowe, addressed those in attendance that he was "extremely pleased with the way the event went off considering

all the changes and obstacles we needed to overcome."

The bishop went on to explain, "We often think of the Christian Family as being similar to the nuclear family of Jesus, Joseph and Mary. So, we often reflect on mom, dad and the children, but Jesus is telling us in this paragraph that it is much bigger than this. It is all of us."

In his message Bishop Sobiechowski reminds us that through baptism we are not only brothers and sisters in Christ, but we are sons and daughters of God.

He went on to say, "We share in the joys of the Christian Family, but that also places on us a responsibility that being brothers and sisters and mothers and fathers to one another."

The bishop further explained his point by also reminding us what Jesus said, "They will know you are my disciples by the way you love one another.'

As part of my own message this month, I would like all of us here at St. Stephen's to dedicate this month to being more active towards others, not only here in our parish, but as the bishop suggests, as part of the greater Christian Family.

"Let us love one another in Christian love," Bishop Sobiechowski concluded in that 2016 video, "so we can truly be a Christian Family for all to see and all to be a part of."

I totally agree. Let us all keep our fellow brothers and sisters in our prayers. Don't forget to join the ANS at the ice cream social on that day, Oct. 13.
